



EXAMINING HOW WE WORK

Prioritizing HOW we do the work just as much as the work itself.

- Root cause accountability: trauma-informed & antiracist
- Many different services offered by many different providers
- Services for youth AND families
- Centering the experts: youth and families
- Funder practice accountability

PRIORITIES FOR ACTION



Improve communication, coordination, and collaboration across service providers



Improve school environments by ending exclusionary practices, and by increasing on-site supports for students



Break-down access barriers for youth and families



Provide more activities for youth, with a focus on safe and unstructured spaces

COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT ACT

July 2024 - June 2025

- New funding from Commerce (CRA)
- \$300K Total
- Core Components
 - Community Capacity Building Grants
 - Collective Impact Model (Violence Reduction Plan)
- Focus on youth at the highest risk for gun violence



PURPOSE

Grow capacity in our community to meet the needs of those youth (ages 10-30) at the highest risk of being impacted by gun violence

AWARDS

\$180K for Subgrants (Six Awards)

- \$25,000 Capacity Building
- \$4,000 Coaching/Consulting
- \$1,000 Healing Stipend



CAPACITY BUILDING PROJECTS

NOT general operating - NOT program funding

Projects that enhance capacity to serve youth at the highest risk of gun violence

- Expand the number of youth served
- Expand the types of services provided
- Improve the quality of services provided
- Improve the efficiency of services provided


Examples

- Growing staff size,
- New staff training or professional development
- Volunteer recruitment or retention,
- Organizational tools or equipment including vehicles and technology
- Partnerships




YOUTH AT THE "HIGHEST RISK"

(Youth = Ages 10-30)



COACHING/CONSULTING



- Optional
- Up to \$4,000 per awarded organization
- Estimated 20 hours at \$200/hour
- Indirect (IJP pays vendor directly)
- Organizations can choose coach/consultant with IJP approval
- Support capacity building project, leadership and/or staff development, organizational culture and antiracism, etc.

ORGANIZATIONAL HEALING

- Optional
- Up to \$1,000 per awarded organization
- Indirect (IJP pays vendor directly)
- Organizations submit proposal to IJP for approval
- Not for your clients/participants! For your leadership/staff/volunteer team
- · Physical, spiritual, social-emotional healing
- Examples:
 - Gym benefits
 - Mental health benefits
 - Yoga or meditation class/retreat
 - Peacemaking circles
 - Paid time off



ELIGIBILITY



MINIMUM CRITERIA:

- 501c3 nonprofit status OR documented 501c3 fiscal sponsorship OR tribal government or organization
- Currently operate in Pierce County, Washington
- Current existing relationships with youth (ages 10-30) and/or families impacted by violence
- Demonstrated need for organizational capacity building
- Ability to comply with all subgrantee expectations within the stated time frame


PRIORITY CRITERIA:

- Staff reflective of the populations served
- Annual operating budgets under \$1 million
- Existing programs or services designed for youth and/or families who are at highest risk of becoming involved in violence, and/or are already connected to the criminal justice system

TIMELINE



APPLICATION PROCESS



- Applications accepted through online form ONLY
- Word template provided for drafting purposes - we do NOT recommend drafting responses directly into the form
- Applications must be received by 12:00pm (noon) on Friday September 13
- Required upload: budget

SCORING PROCESS

- Please review the scoring sheet in the RFP for insight into developing a strong application
- If your organization is NOT applying, consider applying to serve on the scoring team
 - Interest form at <u>imaginejusticeproject.org/peacepointfunding</u>
- Scoring team members review and score applications and collaborate with other team members to reach consensus on funding recommendations (9/13 - 10/15)
- Funding recommendations approved by Peace Point planning team
- \$600 Stipend provided



(ANTICIPATED) REPORTING

- Monthly reports to IJP from November
 2024 June 2025
- BRIEF summary of work completed on the proposed project
- Possible requirement to acknowledge receipt of funds
- Please maintain receipts and invoices related to this funding
